The purpose of this position is to provide guided group tours, indoor and outdoor. This is a 16-week, full-time seasonal position funded by Project Learning Tree and the Rainy River First Nations Trust. This position requires 35 hours of work per week. This position will report to the Manager and the Educational Programming Coordinator at Kay-Nah-Chi-Wah-Nung.

Compensation \$18.00/hr.

The successful candidate will be responsible for:

- Greeting individuals when they enter the Centre.
- Operating the cash register; ringing up sales; maintaining an accurate cash drawer including receipts and reports.
- Escorting groups throughout the interpretive centre and exhibits; providing information about the history and culture.
- Guiding outdoor tours to groups via golf carts, biking or walking, sharing points of interests.

Education and Experience:

- Minimum Grade 12.
- Minimum of 1 years' experience in dealing with the public.
- CPR/First-Aid certification is an asset.

Necessary Knowledge, Skills and Abilities:

- Ability to develop and maintain effective relationships with staff and the public.
- Excellent verbal communication skills.
- Knowledge of Indigenous culture & Rainy River First Nations desired.

- Must be comfortable working outdoors.
- Must be comfortable with physical activity (some heavy lifting may be required).
- Must be comfortable working with individuals of varying age groups.
- Must be able to provide current Criminal Reference Check satisfactory to the First Nation.

- Must have the ability to work flexible work hours, which may include evenings and weekends.
- Must have valid driver's license and access to a vehicle or ability to find alternate means of transportation.
